TEXAS WELL OWNER NETWORK PROGRAM

The Texas Well Owner Network (TWON) program is a free, educational training for Texas residents who depend on household wells for their water needs. TWON is for private well owners who want to become familiar with groundwater resources, septic system maintenance, well maintenance, water quality and water treatment. Private well owners are independently responsible for monitoring the quality of their wells. Samples are to be screened for nitrate–nitrogen, total dissolved solids (TDS) and E. coli bacteria.

The cost for sample is covered by High Plains UWCD #1

Step 1— Pick Up Sample

- Between now and 2 PM, September 13 - Pick up sample containers
- Very Important - Please read instructions for proper sampling timeframe and technics

Step 2—Drop Off Sample

- On September 16 - Bring sample to office anytime from 8:30—10:00 a.m.

Step 3— Results & Interpretation

- On September 18 - Attended educational meeting from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. (Lunch Provided)
